
# St James' Daisy Hill Concert Series

# Stewardship 2019

As we approach the mid-point of the year, it's a good time to look again at our stewardship. Between our three churches we have to pay our Parish Share of £55,000 this year as well as our heating, lighting, insurance bills etc. To do this we need regular and planned giving from individuals to keep the buildings open for worship as a beacon of the life, light and love of Jesus in our parish.

You can give in several ways:

- putting cash on the plate during the collections at our Sunday services
- becoming part of a **planned giving scheme** ask for a pack of weekly envelopes and decide on a regular commitment
- setting up a standing order / direct debit to pay your donations each week or month directly to our bank accounts.

Planned giving is best for us as it allows us to budget throughout the year and demonstrates a commitment to good stewardship.

If you pay tax, then you are eligible to **Gift Aid** your giving. By signing a simple form, we can reclaim from the Inland Revenue 25p for each £1 that you give. One-off donations can be Gift Aided using the blue envelopes available.



lan's known to many of us from his work at Wingates and St. George's churches. Below is a short piece he wrote for the June Diocesan CRUX magazine:

# I remember thinking "I'm, running the wrong race here!"

"I enjoyed working for the NHS in Greater Manchester as a paramedic for 14 years, getting out and about, meeting lots of different people, and the satisfaction of helping."

lan and his wife were involved in their local church where, as churchwarden and ALM, lan was encouraged to give it a go upfront, but he'd always thought of himself as a practical kind of guy, and certainly not an "up at the front" guy in robes!

"Whenever I took the opportunity, there was an unusual sense of peace alongside the nervousness I associated with leading worship. God seemed to be doing something, but it was way outside my comfort zone. I prayed that Go would make it obvious if he wanted me to change direction.

I remember being on a treadmill in the gym and thinking, 'I'm running in completely the wrong race here'. Encouragement from family and friends and church slowly built up, culminating in a line from a sermon which I couldn't get out of my head, @Don't miss out on the opportunity to spend your life on God's work.' "

Encouragements from within and without led lan to taking the step of talking to the director of ordinands and follow the selection process.

"The day I handed back my NHS green uniform to start training at St. Mellitus College was a huge step for me and a big leap into the unknown. Looking back, it took a great many small steps, encouragements and prayers before I was ready to take that leap of faith."

"As I approach ordination, I'm looking forward to sharing in the faith journeys of others and hopefully helping them along the way. I'm thrilled to be serving my curacy at Bolton Parish Church and St. Philip's. If one thing worries me, it's remembering everyone's names."
