Today's Readings

Collect:

Risen Christ, for whom no door is locked, no entrance barred: open the doors of our hearts, that we may seek the good of others and walk the joyful road of sacrifice and peace, to the praise of God the Father. **Amen.**

First Reading: Revelation 1. 4 - 8

John to the seven churches that are in Asia: Grace to you and peace from him who is and who was and who is to come, and from the seven spirits who are before his throne, and from Jesus Christ, the faithful witness, the firstborn of the dead, and the ruler of the kings of the earth. To him who loves us and freed us from our sins by his blood, and made us to be a kingdom, priests serving his God and Father, to him be glory and dominion for ever and ever. Amen.

Look! He is coming with the clouds; every eye will see him, even those who pierced him; and on his account all the tribes of the earth will wail. So it is to be. Amen. I am the Alpha and the Omega, says the Lord God, who is and who was and who is to come, the Almighty.

New Testament Reading: Acts 5. 27 - 32

When the temple police had brought the apostles, they made them stand before the council. The high priest questioned them, saying, We gave you strict orders not to teach in this name, yet here you have filled Jerusalem with your teaching and you are determined to bring this man's blood on us. But Peter and the apostles answered, We must obey God rather than any human authority. The God of our ancestors raised up Jesus, whom you had killed by hanging him on a tree. God exalted him at his right hand as Leader and Saviour that he might give repentance to Israel and forgiveness of sins. And we are witnesses to these things, and so is the Holy Spirit whom God has given to those who obey him.

Gospel Reading John 20. 19 - 31

When it was evening on the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, Peace be with you. After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus

said to them again, Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you. When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained. But Thomas (who was called the Twin), one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, We have seen the Lord. But he said to them, Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe.

A week later his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, Peace be with you. Then he said to Thomas, Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe. Thomas answered him, My Lord and my God! Jesus said to him, Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe. Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book. But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name.



Post-Communion Prayer:

Lord God our Father, through our Saviour Jesus Christ you have assured your children of eternal life and in baptism have made us one with him: deliver us from the death of sin and raise us to new life in your love, in the fellowship of the Holy Spirit, by the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ. **Amen.**

In the Queen's Jubilee year, six people living in the Diocese of Manchester were awarded Maundy money in recognition of their service to the Church and community at a special service on Maundy Thursday at St George's Chapel, Windsor.

The tradition of distribution of alms started in the 12-13th century with the King's Court travelling around the country. From the 15th century the number of recipients has been related to the years of the sovereign's life and since the 18th century an equal number of men and women. This year Maundy money was awarded to 96 men and 96 women.

Organ Music at St. Bartholomew's:

Before the service we'll have another go at getting through the Pachelbel that we didn't reach the end of on Easter Sunday.

We'll finish with the "Chorale Prelude on a Melody by Melchior Vulpius" by Healey Willan. You'll know the tune as "Vulpius" as it's the one sung to the hymn "Good Christians all, rejoice and sing." Willan was born in England but emigrated to Canada in 1913. He wrote over 800 works including operas and works for piano and orchestra but it's his organ music for which he is best remembered today. He was one of the first "Canadian" composers to appear on a Canadian postage stamp and after his death, the park next to the church he served as organist was renamed after him in his honour.

Willan, famously described his own provenance as "English by birth; Canadian by adoption; Irish by extraction; Scotch by absorption"


