Old Testament Reading: Isaiah 40.1 – 11

¹Comfort, O comfort my people, says your God.

²Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and cry to her

that she has served her term, that her penalty is paid, that she has received from the LORD's hand double for all her sins.

³A voice cries out:

'In the wilderness prepare the way of the LORD, make straight in the desert a highway for our God.

⁴Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low; the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain.

⁵Then the glory of the LORD shall be revealed, and all people shall see it together, for the mouth of the LORD has spoken.'

⁶A voice says, 'Cry out!' And I said, 'What shall I cry?' All people are grass, their constancy is like the flower of the field.

⁷The grass withers, the flower fades, when the breath of the LORD blows upon it; surely the people are grass. ⁸The grass withers, the flower fades; but the word of our God will stand for ever.

⁹Get you up to a high mountain, O Zion, herald of good tidings; lift up your voice with strength, O Jerusalem, herald of good tidings, lift it up, do not fear; say to the cities of Judah, 'Here is your God!'

¹⁰See, the Lord GOD comes with might, and his arm rules for him; his reward is with him, and his recompense before him.

¹¹He will feed his flock like a shepherd; he will gather the lambs in his arms, and carry them in his bosom, and gently lead the mother sheep.

New testament Reading: 2 Peter 3. 8 – 15a

⁸Do not ignore this one fact, beloved, that with the Lord one day is like a thousand years, and a

thousand years are like one day. ⁹The Lord is not slow about his promise, as some think of slowness, but is patient with you, not wanting any to perish, but all to come to repentance. ¹⁰But the day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then the heavens will pass away with a loud noise, and the elements will be dissolved with fire, and the earth and everything that is done on it will be disclosed.

¹¹Since all these things are to be dissolved in this way, what sort of persons ought you to be in leading lives of holiness and godliness, ¹²waiting for and hastening the coming of the day of God, because of which the heavens will be set ablaze and dissolved, and the elements will melt with fire? ¹³But, in accordance with his promise, we wait for new heavens and a new earth, where righteousness is at home. ¹⁴Therefore, beloved, while you are waiting for these things, strive to be found by him at peace, without spot or blemish; ¹⁵and regard the patience of our Lord as salvation.

⁴John the baptizer appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. ⁵And people from the whole Judean countryside and all the people of Jerusalem were going out to him, and were baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins. ⁶Now John was clothed with camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey. ⁷He proclaimed, 'The one who is more powerful than I is coming after me; I am not worthy to stoop down and untie the thong of his sandals. ⁸I have baptized you with water; but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit.'

Organ Music - St Bartholomew's

Last week for Advent Sunday we had, before the service, J S Bach's famous arrangement of "Sleepers, Wake" [*Wachet auf, ruft uns die Stimme* BWV 645] which is based on one of the great Advent chorale tunes. It was first performed on 25th November 1731 as part of his advent cantata for the 27th Sunday after Trinity and is a piece where the accompaniment played by the right hand is more famous than the tune played in the left hand. I take it at a rapid pace to try and get the feel of urgency in waking up and being alert and ready [the Gospel for that Sunday was that of the wise and foolish bridesmaids who were / were not prepared].



After the service, as part of the Advent Toccata series [*from the Latin word for "to touch" as opposed to a cantata "to sing" and designed to show off the skills of the organist*] we had the Toccata from the Suite Gothique by Leon Boellmann. The final of the four movements written in 1895 it does have a silent film quality to it of the villain tying heroine to the railway line as the train fast approaches. Northern Rail customers will have to use their imagination.

Boellmann [25 September 1862 – 11 October 1897] wrote about 150 works for organ, mostly quite short of which this is the most famous. He was organist of St Vincent-de-Paul church in Paris [the closest to Gard du Nord, if anyone's visiting] shown here at the console.

This week, some more Bach for Advent. Bach had about nine different attempts at setting the German Chorale "Come thou Saviour of the Gentiles" [*Nun komm, der Heiden Heiland*]. Today's setting BWV659 is the longest and features a walking bass in the pedal line, the accompaniment in the left hand and a very florid, ornamented version of the tune in the right hand. It's a tune we don't use but in the key of G minor, it's trying to convey the longing for the Saviour's coming.

After the service, as part of the Advent Toccata season, we'll have the Dorian Toccata in D minor also by Bach [BWV 538]. It's not the very famous D minor toccata [BWV 565] and is very different from it. It opens with a semiquaver theme which is played throughout the piece by both hands and feet. It contains some very contrapuntal effects where the tune is split between the upper [swell] and lower [great] manuals [keyboards] of the organ and Bach himself even specifies which to use. We think this was very rare in Bach's day as he notes this very rarely and we think organists of that period would select the stops before playing the piece and play the whole piece through without changing manuals or stops.





A reflection for the first week of Advent

John said, “I am, as Isaiah prophesied: a voice that cries in the wilderness: make a straight way for the Lord.” (John 1:23)

These words of John the Baptist set the scene for the gift of Advent – a time to listen, watch, prepare, make ready and welcome.

The voice cries out into the wilderness of our hearts and the busyness of our lives inviting us to make ready our hearts to welcome Jesus in all the ways he comes to us. Advent is an invitation to open our hearts afresh to Jesus, to welcome the light and hope that he alone gives.
