Today's Readings

Collect:

Almighty God, purify our hearts and minds, that when your Son Jesus Christ comes again as judge and saviour, we may be ready to receive him, who is our Lord and God. **Amen.**

Old Testament Reading: Malachi 3. 1 - 4 Thus says the Lord God: See, I am sending my messenger to prepare the way before me, and the Lord whom you seek will suddenly come to his temple. The messenger of the covenant in whom you delight - indeed, he is coming, says the LORD of hosts. 2 But who can endure the day of his coming, and who can stand when he appears? For he is like a refiner's fire and like fullers' soap; 3he will sit as a refiner and purifier of silver, and he will purify the descendants of Levi and refine them like gold and silver, until they present offerings to the LORD in righteousness. 4 Then the offering of Judah and Jerusalem will be pleasing to the LORD as in the days of old and as in former years.

New Testament Reading: Philippians 1. 3 - 11 My brothers and sisters, 3I thank my God every time I remember you, ⁴constantly praying with joy in every one of my prayers for all of you, ⁵because of your sharing in the gospel from the first day until now. 61 am confident of this, that the one who began a good work among you will bring it to completion by the day of Jesus Christ. ⁷It is right for me to think this way about all of you, because you hold me in your heart, for all of you share in God's grace with me, both in my imprisonment and in the defence and confirmation of the gospel. 8For God is my witness, how I long for all of you with the compassion of Christ Jesus. ⁹And this is my prayer, that your love may overflow more and more with knowledge and full insight 10 to help you to determine what is best, so that in the day of Christ you may be pure and blameless, "having produced the harvest of righteousness that

comes through Jesus Christ for the glory and praise of God.

Gospel Reading Luke 3. 1 - 6

In the fifteenth year of the reign of Emperor Tiberius, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea, and Herod was ruler of Galilee, and his brother Philip ruler of the region of Ituraea and Trachonitis, and Lysanias ruler of Abilene, ²during the high-priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John son of Zechariah in the wilderness. ³He went into all the region around the Jordan, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, ⁴as it is written in the book of the words of the prophet Isaiah, 'The voice of one crying out in the wilderness:

"Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight. ⁵Every valley shall be filled, and every mountain and hill shall be made low, and the crooked shall be made straight, and the rough ways made smooth; ⁶and all flesh shall see the salvation of God."

Covid Update

Following the news about the latest Covid Omicron variant, please note that the updated Government advice does not affect services of worship in our churches. As far as we are aware, there is no updated advice from the Government, Church of England or Diocese of Manchester.

We will continue our programme of stringent cleaning prior to services. Please continue to:

- wear a face covering [unless exempt] when arriving at / leaving or moving around the churches
- using the hand sanitiser available when arriving
- not attending if you or someone you live with has symptoms of Covid, are awaiting a test result or have been asked to isolate.

Many thanks for continuing to work with us on this; we are trying to respect everyone's views and run as much as we can while maintaining the health and wellbeing of all.

Organ Music at St. Bartholomew's:

For Advent / Christmas we're running the "Toccata" series. Initially a toccata was a music piece played on a keyboard [from the Latin "toccare" = to touch] as opposed to a cantata which was a sung piece ["cantare" = to sing]. As organs developed, these became showier and flashier with organist/composers writing ever more and faster notes to show off the skill [or not] of the player. They reached their height in the Parisian Organ lofts of the late 19th – early 20th century with way too many notes for the hands and a big tune played on the pedals.



For Advent 2 we're having the Toccata from the Suite Gothique by Leon Boellmann [1862 – 97]. The Toccata of 1895 is probably the best-known and most popular movement of the Suite Gothique. It is a true perpetuum mobile with the hands playing a stream of semiquavers until the last several bars, where the intensity is ramped up for a dramatic ending. It's often described as the music played to accompany that part of the silent film where the villain has tied the heroine to the railway tracks and the train is steaming quickly towards her [probably not Northern Rail, then...] I've played this suite so much over the years, it's actually fallen to pieces and I've had to throw it out and so am

playing today from a new copy.

There are, of course, other organ toccatas from about the same time as the Boëllmann that are constructed similarly, in particular the work by Boëllmann's mentor Eugène Gigout—the *Toccata in B Minor* from 1890—and the famous Widor *Toccata* from 1879.

Boellmann was organist at St Vincent de Paul church in Paris, close to the Gare du Nord and is worth a visit. He married his mentor Eugene Gigout's niece and they lived with him; when Boellmann and his wife both died young in 1897/98, Gigout adopted their three children.

Before the service, we'll get Bach's prelude for Advent "Nun komm, der Heiden Heiland" [O come, thou Saviour of the Gentiles] – an arrangement that tries to convey a yearning for Christ's second coming.



Doors open at 7:30pm for an 8:00pm start. Tickets are £10 on the door and note that there are no refreshments this year.


