Focus on Vocations:

This week: St Bartholomew's choir

Carole Bullough:

I have been a chorister for many years. Having an interest in music I started to learn to play the piano when I was 7 years old. It then felt like a natural progression to join the church choir 4 years later when I was 11.

I have loved every moment of being in a choir. I feel that the role of the choir in leading the congregational singing is an essential, part of praising God. For me, without music and the choir at a church service, something is missing. This was highlighted to me recently when the lockdown restrictions were lifted. The choir returned to participating in Sunday services, after what felt like a very lengthy absence! I was absolutely thrilled about this. It was also uplifting to know that others felt the same. We received such positive feedback from the congregation after the service on that first Sunday morning of the choir's return.

For me, music and being a member of the choir is an integral part of worship.

Carol Evans: My Journey to the Choir

I joined the choir some 35+ years ago just before our new Rector, Revd Simon Tatton-Brown, came when we only had two choristers in the choir.

I do enjoy singing hymns and my new interest brought me to learn how to read music and piano lessons which helped with my choral singing.

I enjoy the choir. It's not just singing hymns on Sunday; we have choir practice every Wednesday night when we learn the hymns for Sunday and anthems for forthcoming special occasions. We also sing, when requested, at other celebrations, one being weddings and if the couple are regular parishioners then that's extra-special. Sometimes, after a few years, we've also sung at their children's weddings.

The congregation only see us now when we come down for communion but if we weren't there at all, I'm sure they would notice very quickly.

I never want my church, our church to be without a choir, so why not come along to a practice and see what we do – you may enjoy it!

I joined the local church choir at about the age of eight which involved two practices and two Sunday services each week. When my voice broke it was suggested that I play the organ instead and for the last 45 years or so that's what I've been doing. I also sang with Salford Choral Society for over 20 years [until I came to this church and choir practice nights clashed] and am a founder member and for over 30 years have sung with St Ann's Hospice Festival choir raising funds for the Hospice.

I started at St Bartholomew's in mid-November 15 years ago, one of the attractions being working with the choir here. We've gained and lost members over the years but the patience and dedication of our choir always astounds me as we come out each week of the year to practice and lead the worship at our services. Music and singing were the first things people wanted back after the Covid restrictions and it's been wonderful to be leading the way to the new normality.

We rehearse each Wednesday in church from 7:30pm and welcome anyone of any age if you enjoy singing. If you're interested, do come and have a word.

At the 10:00am service, numbers are strictly limited on a first come- first seated policy. Once all seats are filled, the doors will be closed and no further people can be admitted.


The outdoor Act of Worship at the War Memorial including the two-minute silence will be open to everyone and that will be followed by our usual service of Holy Communion at 11:30am.
