Old Testament Reading Genesis 32. 22 - 31

²² acob got up, took his two wives, his two maids, and his eleven children, and crossed the ford of the Jabbok. 23He took them and sent them across the stream, and likewise everything that he had. ²⁴Jacob was left alone; and a man wrestled with him until daybreak. 25When the man saw that he did not prevail against Jacob, he struck him on the hip socket; and Jacob's hip was put out of joint as he wrestled with him. ²⁶Then he said, 'Let me go, for the day is breaking.' New Testament Reading: 2 Timothy 3. 14 – 4. 5 ¹⁴Continue in what you have learned and firmly believed, knowing from whom you learned it, ¹⁵and how from childhood you have known the sacred writings that are able to instruct you for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. ¹⁶All scripture is inspired by God and is useful for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, ¹⁷so that everyone who belongs to God may be proficient, equipped for every good work.

In the presence of God and of Christ Jesus, who is to judge the living and the dead, and in view of his appearing and his kingdom, I solemnly urge you: ²proclaim the message; be persistent whether the time is favourable or unfavourable; convince, rebuke, and encourage, with the utmost patience in teaching. ³For the time is coming when people will not put up with sound doctrine, but having itching ears, they will accumulate for themselves teachers to suit their own desires, ⁴and will turn away from listening to the truth and wander away to myths. ⁵As for you, always be sober, endure suffering, do the work of an evangelist, carry out your ministry fully.

Gospel Readina Luke 18. 1 - 8 Jesus told his disciples a parable about their need to pray always and not to lose heart. 2He said, 'In a certain city there was a judge who neither feared God nor had respect for people. 3In that city there was a widow who kept coming to him and saying, "Grant me justice against my opponent." 4For a while he refused; but later he said to himself, "Though I have no fear of God and no respect for anyone, syet because this widow keeps bothering me, I will grant her justice, so that she may not wear me out by continually coming." 'And the Lord said, 'Listen to what the unjust judge says. 7And will not God grant justice to his chosen ones who cry to him day and night? Will he delay long in helping them? 81 tell you, he will quickly grant justice to them. And yet, when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?'

FOCUS ON VOCATIONS – Authorised Lay Ministers

Authorised Lay Ministers are people active in church life, who have been identified by their parish as having a particular gifting, vocation or calling to leadership in an area of ministry. ALM training begins each January and consists of an 8-week Core Leadership Module followed by a 12-week Ministry Training Elective. There are currently ten electives available covering ministry in many different areas in church life from worship & Liturgy, community outreach, ecology, digital church, evangelism, children & youth work, prayer and pastoral outreach.

In our team ministry we currently have 7 ALMs. We asked them to tell us in 100 words why they chose to train and be an ALM. This is what they said.

Evelyn Eden – Worship & Liturgy Elective

On first coming to St John's, we helped with music but I felt a God nudge – He wanted more! With PCC encouragement, I undertook the ALM Worship & Liturgy course helping me explore how we lead and incorporate worship into our Sunday services and day-to-day lives. It was also a safe space to develop and get feedback. Since then, I have been encouraged use my gifts, including more recently helping with Ignite Youth (our Team Youth Church).

God has been faithful: Being confident of this very thing, that He who has begun a good work in you will complete it.

Jane Kenyon – Pastoral & Listening Elective

I felt I wanted to go deeper in my Christian faith and enrolled on a Foundations in Ministry course. I was just wanting to explore my faith and see where God led me in it. We looked at different vocations and pathways we could follow.

More and more I felt God was leading me to enrol for ALM training. I felt it was the right thing to do but didn't know where it would lead. I followed the Pastoral and Listening Elective. This was an easy choice as I have experience in Counselling and Social Care and as a Samaritan volunteer. I have a strong sense to reach out to others in fellowship - helping to make people feel welcome, wanted and valued. Especially those feeling alone and lost.

I love working with people and I am hoping to be able to share my faith as God leads me, I am eager to follow.

Christine Andrews – Worship & Liturgy Elective

I had worked with children as a leader in Sunday-School and the youth group. I saw becoming an ALM as a way to increase my own knowledge of Jesus and to help others to learn about him. Becoming an ALM allowed me to work with whole congregations and to support ministry in our parish.

Ten years on I am still learning and enjoying my ministry.

Barbara Berry – Worship & Liturgy Elective

Being an ALM is not only a privilege but a great pleasure to me. It's my way of spreading the good news, of shouting to the world (albeit often a small congregation) how much being a Christian and following in the footsteps of our Lord Jesus Christ means to me.

Whatever task I have, preparing prayers, bible readings, leading a service, comforting a dear friend, or simply arranging flowers in church, all have equal importance, and I feel blessed that I was invited to do it, and led by God. The training was a joy, I learned so much.

Alisdair Cole – Worship & Liturgy Elective

I am very much in the camp of Traditionalism, as far removed from Activism as you can get. Yet the nudges I kept getting in my own faith made me accept that I too have a pro-active role as a servant in God's Church.

Following a time of prayer & reflection, I discerned that I would only know for sure if I was a suitable ALM candidate if I applied. This I duly did and was relieved when accepted into the 2022 cohort for training.

Fast forward twelve months to September and amazingly The Bishop of Bolton authorized me at Manchester Cathedral, and I am an Authorised Lay Minister.

Recording Attendance for School Admission

Parents will need to sign registers or, in the case of St Thomas, have their card stamped if they physically attend the service – nothing else will count.

Card Reader

We now have a card reader at St. Bartholomew's church that we'll have out in the narthex at our services and events if you wish to donate to the upkeep of our churches that way and don't have any cash on you.

It's just like any card machine – you enter the amount you wish to give and simply touch-and-go or enter your card and PIN. If you enter your mobile number, you can have a receipt sent directly to your 'phone.

There will be instructions by it and someone to demonstrate it if you're not sure.

The cost to the church is minimal [less than Ip per transaction] so it's an easy and effective way to give to our churches.

St George's School Governors

St George's Primary School is seeking new Foundation Governors to serve on its Governing Board. Like all school governors, Foundation Governors work to support the Headteacher, staff and children, but they also have a special responsibility to support the Christian ethos of the school.

This is an important and rewarding voluntary role, offering the opportunity to make a positive difference, and to be part of the team working to promote the school's success. Foundation Governors need not be professionals or experts in the field of education, but simply need an interest in the school and in the welfare of our children, and the time and willingness to get involved.

The time commitment required is approximately 6-8 hours each term, comprising of two meetings per term, some preparation time for those meetings, and some additional time supporting monitoring activities in school. The meetings are usually held in the evening apart from one meeting during the day in the summer term.




